Also remember your loved ones by not only submitting their names, but by attending the holy services to offer your own prayers for their eternal rest.


Anyone wishing to do so may also bring or order a dish of memorial wheat ("kollyva") for use during the service.

The Spiritual Aspect of Fatherhood

I recently read this article and thought it would be appropriate for our June Magazine since Father's Day is coming up. I hope you enjoy it! Fr. John


A conference participant once asked the speaker, "What is the best way for a father to love his children?" The speaker replied, "The best way for a father to love his children is to love their mother." I reflect often upon that superbly accurate statement. And I think the reverse is equally true: the best way a mother can love her children is to love their father.

More than anything else in the world, children need a loving

family and parents who support each other, even if the parents are apart through separation or divorce.

Christ challenges us to love one another, and that challenge becomes even more compelling within our own families. Even in the best of families, there is brokenness. And that is why the man's call to fatherhood is so important. We fathers are called to show our families strong, manly love and forgiveness, virtues modeled powerfully in the father of the prodigal son (Lk 11:32).

This father is stable, loving, and generous. In his fairness, he avoids violating the freedom of either of his sons. When the prodigal demands his inheritance and decides to leave, the father does not attempt to withhold the money. He



does not pressure the son to stay by trying to make him feel guilty. And the father is wise enough not to send money or care packages to relieve the son's distress. The father allows both of his adult sons to make their own mistakes and to learn from their failures, an appropriate form of discipline for older adolescents and young adults.

The prodigal's father demonstrates manly leadership by taking loving

initiatives, and he takes many such initiatives. He maintains a thriving business to provide the generous inheritance. He creates and supports a loving family for the prodigal to run from and for the older son to remain with. And there is his last generous, joyful initiative as he runs out to embrace the returning son, kiss him, and put on him the best robe, ring, and shoes. He celebrates the return of his son with a feast. And in a scene, all of us fathers can recognize, he opens up the conversation with the sulking older son.

The father takes the initiative in bringing about forgiveness and reconciliation in the whole family. He is a model for us in responding to our call to follow the Spirit of Jesus in taking many initiatives in our families, especially that of boundless forgiveness for our children.

When a father takes responsibility for his own spiritual life, for the way he prays, goes to church, and practices virtue in the family, he gives good example. Then his leadership in the family is authentic, based on his own solid relationship with God, and he is less likely to be concerned about any resistance his children may give him. He can lead family prayer. When I suggest that we stand in the living room and pray before a trip or that we pray in a restaurant, I often feel an initial resistance in my children. But

quiet cooperation and peacefulness soon follow. Sometimes the children will even tell me that they prayed in a restaurant when I was not there.

At times the father's role of leading the family to great forgiveness and prayerfulness is an unpopular one. But as a man grows in his own spiritual life, he becomes more sturdy and willing to accept responsibility. Although all this is impossible for us fathers to do alone, with God we can do all things. God can even bestow the awesome spiritual power of fatherhood upon us.



Konstantinos Zervos



Synaxis of the 12 Apostles



On the 30th of June, the Greek Orthodox Church commemorates the Synaxis (a celebratory gathering) of the Twelve Holy Apostles. The commemoration of a Synaxis is commonly observed on the day following a major feast day.

It recognizes the participation of a Saint or a group of Saints in the major feast preceding the Synaxis. For example, the Church holds a Synaxis in honour of St John the Baptist on the day after the Theophany.

The feast of the Synaxis of the Twelve Holy Apostles follows the feast of the pre-eminent apostles Peter and Paul (29 June). Each of the Twelve is honoured on separate dates of the Church calendar. However the Church, in its wisdom, also established a collective commemoration of the Twelve Holy Apostles. This, because the group of Twelve Apostles, fulfilled the Lord's commission to "Go… make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Mat 28:19).

The names of the Twelve Apostles are: Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew, the First-called; James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John, who was also the Evangelist and Theologian; Philip, and Bartholomew (see also June 11); Thomas, and Matthew the publican, who was also called Levi and was an Evangelist; James the son of Alphaeus, and Jude (also called Lebbaeus, and surnamed Thaddaeus), the brother of James, the Brother of God; Simon the Cananite ("the Zealot"), and Matthias, who was elected to fill the place of Judas the traitor.

Synaxis of the Holy, Glorious and All-Praised Twelve Apostles

Commemorated on June 30

The Synaxis of the Glorious and All-Praiseworthy Twelve Apostles

of Christ appears to be an ancient Feast. The Church honors each of the Twelve Apostles on separate dates during the year and has established a general commemoration for all of them on the day after the commemoration of the Glorious and First-Ranked among the Apostles Peter and Paul.

The holy God-crowned Emperor Constantine the Great (May 21) built a church in Constantinople in honor of the Twelve Apostles. There are instructions for celebrating this Feast which date from the fourth century. For lists of the Apostles? names, see: Mt.10:2, Mark 3:14, Luke 6:12, Acts 1:13, 26.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Andrew the First-called is also commemorated on November 30. He was the brother of Saint Peter (June 29).

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle James is also commemorated on April 30. He and his brother John are the sons of Zebedee and were called "sons of Thunder" (Mark 3: 17).

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle and Evangelist, virgin, and beloved friend of Christ, John the Theologian is also commemorated on September 26 and May 8. He and his brother James are the sons of Zebedee and were called "sons of Thunder" (Mark 3:17).

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Philip is also commemorated on November 14.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Bartholomew is also commemorated on June 11 and August 25.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Thomas is also commemorated on October 6 and on the Sunday after Pascha.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle and Evangelist Matthew is also commemorated on November 16.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle James, the son of Alphaeus, is also commemorated on October 9.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Jude is also commemorated on June 19. He is also known as Thaddeus (but should not be confused with Saint Thaddeus of the Seventy, who is commemorated on August 21), and was the brother of Saint James (October 23).

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Simon the Zealot is also commemorated on May 10.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Matthias is also commemorated on August 9.



QUESTION: What were the occupations of the 12 disciples?

ANSWER:

The Sea of Galilee offered fishermen a livelihood for many generations. Perhaps that is why at least seven of the disciples were fishermen. The calling of the Jewish fishermen was the first step by which God would bring the light of the Gospel to shine on all people.

Much of a fisherman's day was spent mending or washing his nets. Andrew was doing just that when Jesus called him as a disciple (Luke 5:2). His brother, Peter, watched Jesus climb into his boat, then preach to the people. He realized that Jesus was not only a prophet, but someone to whom he would surrender his life. James and his brother, John, were mending nets with their father when Jesus called them. These two "sons of Zebedee" were not just fishermen. As business owners, they hired other men to work for them.

While fishing was a respectable vocation, not all the occupations of the 12 disciples were viewed favorably. When Jesus first called Matthew, the disciple was sitting at the tax collector's booth (Matthew 9:9-13). Matthew belonged to the class of Jewish tax collectors (mokhsa) who extorted money from travelers. Publicans or tax collectors were despised, regarded as traitors to their own people. Their money was considered unclean and those taxed would avoid asking for change. A publican's money could not be tithed to the temple. Publicans were forbidden to testify in court. A good Jew would not even associate with publicans in private life. Jesus upset the Pharisees when He enjoyed a meal at Matthew's house (Matthew 9:10-13).

While not strictly a profession, Simon the Canaanite, earned the title of zealot. His fierce loyalty to his faith and Israel was evident. The zealots were a religious sect, zelotes, from the Greek 'zealous one.' Zealots would attempt to arouse rebellion among the Jews. Like others, Simon stubbornly insisted that the Jews must rebel against the Roman (Pompey's) invasion of Palestine in 63 B.C. This invasion had destroyed the Jews' hopes of restoring their own government once again. Zealots, like Simon, engaged in politics and anarchy in hopes of instigating a revolution that would overthrow the Roman government. When

Simon joined Jesus as a disciple, he remained zealous, but with a new allegiance and loyalty to Jesus, rather than a political revolution.

Occupations of the 12 Disciples - Unknown

Not all the occupations of the 12 disciples are known. Thomas and Bartholomew (Nathanael) may have been fishermen, who joined the other five disciples, returning to their profession after Jesus' crucifixion (John 21:2-3). It is possible that these disciples had learned the fishing trade as young men. This time the risen Christ would show Himself not to all Twelve, but to only seven of them. In all likelihood Philip, James (the son of Alphaeus), and Judas (Thaddaeus) were tradesmen of some sort. Regardless of their professions, eleven of the disciples immediately left behind everything to follow Jesus. Judas Iscariot, chosen by Jesus as treasurer, appears to be the only disciple who struggled continually with financial insecurity.

The skills needed in the occupations of the 12 disciples became applicable to the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20). Fishermen often worked long into the night, using two types of nets. The circular net, about 15 feet (4.5 meters) in diameter with fine mesh, was cast in shallow water. The long net—sometimes nearly 328 feet (100 meters) long and 8 feet (2.5 meters) wide—was a dragnet in deeper waters. A well-flung net would drop over a school of fish, bringing in everything it had trapped. The disciples would be "casting their nets" in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. The Lord would provide the miraculous catch.

The once prosperous Matthew, along with the other disciples, learned that God would meet their every need as they preached. "Do not take along any gold or silver or copper in your belts; take no bag for the journey, or extra tunic, or sandals or a staff; for the worker is worth his keep" (Matthew 10:5-10). Jesus sent these ordinary men out, endowed with His own power and authority. As long as they relied on His strength, they were unstoppable. "Then the disciples went out and preached everywhere, and the Lord worked with them and confirmed his word by the signs that accompanied it" (Mark 16:20).

Βεβαίως ὑπάρχουν καὶ οἱ μνῆμές τους σὲ διάφορες ἡμερομηνίες τοῦ λειτουργικοῦ ἔτους, ἀλλὰ μὲ αὐτὸ τὸ συλλογικὸ ἑορτασμὸ τιμᾶται σύμπασα ἡ χορεία τῶν μεγάλων αὐτῶν ἀνδρῶν, οἱ ὁποῖοι ὡς συνεχιστὲς τοῦ σωτηριώδους ἔργου τοῦ Κυρίου ἐπὶ τῆς γῆς, ἔστρεψαν τὸ ροῦ τῆς ἱστορίας καὶ ἄλλαξαν κυριολεκτικὰ τὴ μορφὴ τοῦ κόσμου.

Χάρη στὸν ἰδικό τους ἀγώνα, τὶς ἀφάνταστες προσωπικὲς τους θυσίες, τὴ μαρτυρία καὶ τὸ μαρτύριό τους ἐθεμελιώθηκε ἡ Ἐκκλησία στὸν κόσμο.

Ή λέξη «Ἀπόστολος» σημαίνει τὸν ἀπεσταλμένο. Έν προκειμένω Ἀπόστολοι ὀνομάσθηκαν οἱ ἐκλεγμένοι καὶ καλεσμένοι ἀπὸ τὸν Κύριο Μαθητές Του νὰ συνεχίσουν τὸ σωστικό Του ἔργο, μετὰ τὴν εἰς τοὺς οὐρανοὺς Ἀνάληψή Του. Ἐπίσης, σύμφωνα μὲ τὴν χαρακτηριστική Του προτροπὴ ἔγιναν οἱ μάρτυρες τῆς Ἀναστάσεώς Του «ἔως ἐσχάτου τῆς γῆς».

Ή ἐκλογὴ καὶ ἡ κλήση τῶν Ἀποστόλων, οἱ ὁποῖοι ὡς τὴν Πεντηκοστὴ καλοῦνταν Μαθητές, ἔγινε ἀμέσως μὲ τὴν ἀρχὴ τῆς δημόσιας δράσεως τοῦ Κυρίου, στὴ Γαλιλαία.

Εὐθὺς μετὰ τὴ Βάπτισή Του κατευθύνθηκε στὶς ὅχθες τῆς λίμνης Γενησαρέτ, ὅπου ἀπευθύνθηκε στοὺς ἐκεῖ ἀλιεῖς, στοὺς ὁποίου εἶπε: «δεῦτε ὀπίσω μου καὶ ποιήσω ὑμᾶς ἀλιεῖς ἀνθρώπων». Αὐτοὶ «εὐθέως ἀφέντες τὰ δίκτυα ἠκολούθησαν αὐτῶ». Ἄλλοι, «ἀφέντες τὸν πατέρα αὐτῶν Ζεβεδαῖον ἐν τῷ πλοίῳ μετὰ τῶν μισθωτῶν, ἀπῆλθον ὀπίσω αὐτοῦ».



Οἱ μαθητὲς ὁρίσθηκαν ἀπὸ τὸν Κύριο σὲ τρεῖς κύκλους ἤτοι: τὸ στενὸ κύκλο τῶν Δώδεκα, τὸν εὐρύτερο κύκλο τῶν Ἑβδομήκοντα καὶ τὸν εὐρύτατο κύκλο τῶν πολυπληθῶν φίλων Του. Μεγαλύτερη σημασία εἶχε ὁ κύκλος τῶν Δώδεκα. Αὐτοὶ εὑρίσκονταν πλησίον Του καὶ σ' αὐτοὺς ἀποκάλυψε τὰ μυστήρια τοῦ Θεοῦ.

<u>Βίος καὶ Πολιτεία τοῦ Ἁγίου Διονυσίου τοῦ</u> <u>Ἀρεοπαγίτου</u>

Αὐτοὶ εἶχαν τὴν εὐλογία καὶ τὴ δόξα νὰ ὁρισθοῦν ὡς οἱ κατ' ἐξοχὴν συνεχιστὲς τοῦ ἔργου Του, διότι μόνο σὲ αὐτοὺς εἶπε: «Ἐγὼ ἐξελεξάμην ὑμᾶς, καὶ ἔθηκα ὑμᾶς, ἵνα ὑμεῖς ὑπάγητε καὶ καρπὸν φέρητε, καὶ ὁ καρπὸς ἡμῶν μένῃ». Μετὰ τὴν Ἀνάσταση τοὺς κατέστησε ἐπίσημα διαδόχους καὶ συνεχιστὲς τοῦ ἔργου Του: «καθὼς ἀπέσταλκέ με ὁ Πατήρ, κάγὼ πέμπω ὑμᾶς.

Καὶ τοῦτο εἰπὼν ἐνεφύσησε καὶ λέγει αὐτοῖς· λάβετε Πνεῦμα Ἅγιον, ἄν τινων ἀφῆτε τὰς ἀμαρτίας, ἀφίενται αὐτοῖς, ἄν τινων κρατῆτε, κεκράτηνται».

Ἐπίσης στὸ ὄρος τῆς Γαλιλαίας, ὅπου εἶχαν συναχθεῖ οἱ ἕνδεκα μαθητές, λίγο πρὶν τὴν

Άνάληψη, τοὺς εἶπε: «Πορευθέντες μαθητεύσατε πάντα τὰ ἔθνη, βαπτίζοντες αὐτοὺς εἰς τὸ ὄνομα τοῦ Πατρός, τοῦ Υἱοῦ καὶ τοῦ Ἁγίου Πνεύματος, διδάσκοντες αὐτοὺς τηρεῖν πάντα ὅσα ἐνετειλάμην ὑμῖν».

Ώς πρὸς τὴν ἐκλογὴ τῶν Ἁγίων Ἀποστόλων εἶναι χαρακτηριστικοὶ οἱ λόγοι τοῦ Ἀποστόλου Παύλου: «Ἐπειδὴ γὰρ ἐν τῆ σοφία τοῦ Θεοῦ οὐκ ἔγνω ὁ κόσμος διὰ τῆς σοφίας τὸν Θεόν... τὰ μωρὰ τοῦ κόσμου ἐξελέξατο ὁ Θεός, ἵνα τοὺς σοφοὺς καταισχύνῃ τὰ ἰσχυρά, καὶ τὰ ἀγενῆ τοῦ κόσμου καὶ τὰ ἐξουθενημένα ἐξελέξατο ὁ Θεός, καὶ τὰ μὴ ὄντα, ἵνα τὰ ὄντα καταργήσῃ, ὅπως μὴ καυχήσηται πᾶσα σὰρξ ἐνώπιον τοῦ Θεοῦ».

Τὸ ἔργο τῶν Ἁγίων Ἀποστόλων συνεχίσθηκε καὶ συνεχίζεται διὰ τῶν διαδόχων αὐτῶν. Αὐτὴ ἡ άδιάκοπη διαδοχὴ συνεχίζεται ἔως σήμερα καὶ χαρακτηρίζεται ὡς ἀδιάκοπη διαδοχὴ προσώπων καὶ πίστεως καὶ γι' αὐτὸ ὀνομάζεται ἡ Ἐκκλησία μας Ἀποστολική.

FOLLOWING CHRIST EVEN IN STORMS

How do we follow Jesus?

"Now when He got into a boat, His disciples followed Him" (Matthew 8:23). Why? "To cross over to the other side" (Mark 4:35). Isn't this our present challenge? How are we to cross over to the "other side", to a life where our humanity reaches out to our fullness in divinity? To bring this into meaningful context, let us look at an important moment. Jesus said to a certain disciple, "Follow Me, and let the dead bury their

own dead" (Matthew 8:22). Follow? How are we to understand this familiar command in the context of Jesus, in the context of a pandemic?

"And 'suddenly' a great tempest arose on the sea, so that the boat was covered with waves" (Matthew 8:24). Conflict, crisis - odd, yet so relevant to our current fear of a virus that seems to be "covering our lives, our boat, with waves"! Where was Jesus? "But He was asleep" (Matthew 8:24). Mark tells us that Jesus was "in the stern, asleep on a pillow" (Mark 4:38). A storm, threatening their very lives, and Jesus asleep, in the stern, on a pillow! What are we to make of this? We are in a pandemic, the world is in turmoil, climate concern is urgent, racial violence escalates, gender inequality redefines who we are as person, the waves grow more intense, the boat is ready to break. Where is Jesus? Why does it even matter where He might be - unless it truly matters! He is sleeping, and comfortably on a pillow! How can this be in this crisis? How ironic that just a short while ago, Jesus said, "the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head" (Matthew 8:21). And here He is, asleep on a "pillow"!

"Then His disciples came to Him and awoke Him" (Matthew 8:25). Are we at a point where it's time to "wake Him"? To do so means we need Him. Are we there where without Him we perish? They submit to



Him as an admission, a confession, of their inability to save themselves, "Lord, save us. We are perishing!" (Matthew 8:25). Can we be so honest in our current predicament, our current pandemic, that without the "Lord", we cannot save ourselves? Do we dare admit, to humble our stubborn pride, and say imploringly, "Lord, we are perishing"?

This virus will not defeat who we are. It

does not even compare to the enormous sufferings we have inflicted on so many in the history of our humanity. We have produced storm after storm of suffering and misery on our brothers and sisters because we were unwilling to love in the way God loves us. The waves of destruction, of death, have threatened our boat. Today, it seems these waves are raging still. As He is awakened, Jesus asks one of His most remarkable questions, "Why are you fearful?" (Matthew 8:26). This is His guestion to each of us as we live in this fear. "O you of little faith!" Imagine yourself standing before Christ with our fear and trembling of being overcome by the "waves" of this crisis, our crisis. Seriously - who is it you are following? Perhaps the one good thing about this pandemic, this exaggerated fear a virus is producing in many of us, is that we are getting a chance to see who leads us, who we are following.

"Then He arose and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Peace, be still'! And there was a great calm" (Mark 4:39). And Jesus turned to His disciples, as he turns to each one of us, "Why are you so fearful? How is it that you have no faith?" (Mark 4:40). Is Jesus speaking to each of us?

How do you follow Jesus? Who else will you follow but Jesus?






